

The work of the Oregon State Public Health Laboratory affects every Oregonian and includes:

- Conducting 6 million tests on 450,000 samples per year;
- Testing 1,400 babies daily;
- Assuring quality testing in 2,200 clinical and environmental laboratories;
- Serving more than 3,500 clinics, hospitals and health departments in six states;
- Performing 2,400 TB tests, 24,000 HIV tests, 12,000 hepatitis tests and 70,000 sexually transmissible infection tests per year.
