The Hygienic Laboratory's Environmental and Public Health Ambassador will be taking the national stage on Saturday, Jan. 30, when she competes in the Miss America Pageant. The pageant has awarded scholarships since 1945 and is the world's largest scholarship provider for women.

Anne Michael Langguth, from Iowa City, will represent the state as Miss Iowa in the program that airs live at 8 p.m. on TLC. That network also will host a one-hour preview special at 9 p.m. Jan. 29. Following this broadcast, viewers will have the chance to vote four contestants directly into the pageant's top 15.

A 2009 Harvard graduate who has been accepted to the University of Iowa Carver School of Medicine, Langguth became the
