

Competency Guidelines for Public Health Laboratory Professionals





In a project sponsored by CDC and APHL, approximately 170 subject matter experts with diverse backgrounds and experiences in laboratory science and public health developed and reviewed the first ever comprehensive set of competencies for laboratory professionals:



Competencies were targeted for the PHL community but can apply to many laboratory types!

WHY Competencies?

- Outline the knowledge, skills, and abilities necessary for PHL professionals to efficiently and effectively deliver the core services of PHLs
- Pave the way for quality improvement and for enhanced personnel management and workforce development:
 - Defining career ladders
 - Articulating staff performance expectations
 - Developing standardized position descriptions (e.g., Biosafety Outreach Officer)
 - · Identifying and supporting training needs
 - · Providing a guideline for personal professional development
 - · Assessing individual staff performance
 - · Enhancing organizational capacity
